Dear Notice Administrator:

In my letter of Aug. 20, 1999 to the Settlement Class Council sent to PO Box 8300 I requested detailed background information on each the "Class Representatives".

Until I receive this information, I want, as an individual, express my objection, to including in the five classes, individuals and institutions that were not effected by the actions of the Swiss Banks, the Swiss Government or Corporations having dealt with the Swiss Banks during World War II.

As I understand it, this settlements is to avoid litigation by individuals and businesses including their heirs who have seriously been hurt by actions of the Swiss Banks. It is not a general hand out as was previously provided from special funds established by the Banks.

The distribution of this settlement should be carried out utilizing detailed documentation or anecdotal evidence by heirs and should be adjusted for any capital gains and inflation for each class.

Only if there are funds left over after all individuals and businesses have been adequately compensated, should any balances be distributed to organizations which are involved in education on the Holocaust, such as the Holocaust Museum in Washington. I see no sense to allocate funds to Institutions in dying Jewish Communities. Obviously people still living in such communities, having hopefully received large distributions, could donate funds for maintaining cemeteries, synagoges and other historical evidence of Jewish life.

Please seriously consider my comments in your determination how to finalize the criteria for distributing the settlement fund.
